

## **Supreme Court Judgments and Developments**

Online Gaming Ban: The Court took up several petitions challenging the new Promotion and Regulation of Online Gaming Act, 2025. To ensure consistency, it transferred all related cases from various high courts (including Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, and Delhi) to itself. The Act, which received presidential assent in August, imposes a complete ban on real-money online gaming, regardless of whether it is a game of skill or chance.

Stray Animal Menace: Following an initial "harsh" order directing the removal and confinement of all stray dogs in Delhi NCR, a three-judge bench of the Supreme Court modified its own directive. The court noted the order was "unworkable" and reiterated that sterilized and vaccinated stray dogs should be released back into their localities, with exceptions for aggressive or rabid animals. This new ruling aligns with the Animal Birth Control Rules, 2023.

Worker Compensation: A significant ruling clarified that accidents occurring while commuting to or from work should be treated as work-related. The court ruled that employees or their families are entitled to compensation under labor laws, even if the accident happens outside the immediate work site

Family Law: The Supreme Court ruled that a father has a natural duty to contribute to his daughter's marriage expenses, regardless of a strained relationship with his spouse. The court directed the father to pay a reasonable amount, stating this is a natural extension of his parental duties.

Governor's Powers to Withhold Bills: The Supreme Court initiated hearings on petitions from several states challenging the power of governors to indefinitely delay or "kill" bills passed by state legislatures. The court is considering whether to set a clear deadline for governors to act, a ruling that could significantly reshape the balance of power between the central government and states.

Property Law: The Supreme Court clarified a crucial distinction between joint family property and self-acquired property. In a landmark ruling, the court emphasized that the mere existence of a joint Hindu family doesn't automatically transform a father's separate or self-acquired property into joint family property. The burden of proof to demonstrate that a property is a joint family asset lies with the claimant.

Gift Deed: The court also ruled on the validity of a gift deed versus a will. The distinction, according to the court, hinges on whether the transfer of interest in the property is immediate (in praesenti) or is intended to take effect only after the death of the executant. If the transfer is immediate and the executant gives up their interest, it's a gift deed and cannot be unilaterally revoked. If the transfer is only to take effect upon death, it's a will and can be revoked.

## **Key Legislation and Bills**

The Promotion and Regulation of Online Gaming Bill, 2025: This law was enacted to regulate the rapidly growing online gaming sector. It provides a legal framework for both e-sports and online gaming, with a focus on distinguishing between games of skill and games of chance to ensure consumer protection and prevent fraud.

The National Sports Governance Bill, 2025: Passed to improve transparency and accountability in sports federations across India, this bill is designed to ensure better management, proper use of funds, and a greater role for athletes in the governance of their respective sports.

Maritime Bills: Several bills related to ports and shipping were passed, including the Indian Ports Bill, 2025, the Merchant Shipping Bill, 2025, and others, which aim to modernize and streamline India's maritime laws to align with global standards.

Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Bill, 2025: This bill amends existing legislation to simplify regulations and attract private investment in the mining sector.

### Major Regulatory Changes

resulted in "Next-Gen GST Reforms" that are simplifying the Goods and Services Tax structure. The most significant change is the shift to a two-slab structure of 5% and 18%, eliminating the 12% and 28% rates. The reforms also reduced taxes on essential goods and increased rates on luxury and "sin" goods like tobacco and aerated drinks, which are now taxed at 40%.

The Income Tax Act, 2025: This landmark legislation was passed to modernize and simplify India's direct tax framework. The new law aims to replace the outdated Income-tax Act of 1961 with a more transparent and taxpayer-friendly system. Key features include a simplified structure, the introduction of the concept of a "Tax Year," and a focus on digital compliance and faceless assessments to reduce human interaction and corruption.

## Case Study: Theobroma

### From Brownies to Billion-Dollar Moves — ChrysCapital Buys 90% Stake in Theobroma in Historic Deal

Theobroma was established in 2004 by sisters Kainaz Messman Harchandrai and Tina Messman Wykes, Theobroma grew from a small Colaba café into a 225-outlet pan-India chain, renowned for gooey brownies, butter croissants, and array of puffs, sandwiches, and celebration cakes. Today, it is one of India's best-known names in the premium bakery space, with vast brand loyalty in metros and image of product consistency and quality.

### Deal Overview and Financial Dip Illustrated

ChrysCapital's purchase of a 90% stake in Theobroma, subject to Competition Commission of India (CCI) approval, reflects renewed confidence in India's quick-service restaurant (QSR) and café industries.

The deal, worth ₹2,410 crore, followed a temporary financial dip for Theobroma—a detail that influenced the final figure.

Nature of the Financial Dip: The "financial dip" mainly describes a contraction in Theobroma's margins after COVID, with year-on-year revenue or profit growth failing to live up to earlier expectations.

Although it still witnessed stunning growth— ₹400 crore in revenue for FY24 and estimated ₹525-550 crore for FY25-shortterm pressures on profitability and cost increases were the reasons for the downward revision in valuation. Slowerthan-anticipated store ramp-ups and residual inflationary impacts on raw material prices also moderated near-term financial results.

# Why the ₹2,410 Crore Valuation is a Milestone Transaction

Even though below the initial negotiated ₹3,000 crore, the ₹2,410 crore deal is a milestone transaction in India's food service industry for a variety of reasons.

Industry Multiples and Benchmarks: The transaction values Theobroma at an estimated 5-6x forward revenues, and 24-30x expected EBITDA (₹80-100 crore for FY25), and is in extremely favorable comparison with recent transactions in the QSR and bakery segment, where brands hardly receive such top-end multiples. A size of this magnitude for a niche, single-category (premium bakery) player creates a new benchmark in Indian F&B transactions.

Scarcity of Scale and Premium Brand: With big food service deals being a novelty these days, this deal announces investor demand for scaled, profitable, homegrown brands with established growth and brand equity.

### Competitive Advantages: Why Theobroma Attracted Heavyweight Interest

Theobroma's strength lies in a number of fundamental strengths:

**Brand Differentiation:** Theobroma's credibility in the premium bakery space is undergirded by signature products especially its brownies and cakes—that have cult status, thereby supporting the ability to maintain premium pricing.

**Pan-India Footprint:** Its ability to scale beyond Mumbai and perform in diverse metro and Tier 1 markets has been matched by few competitors.

## Case Study: Theobroma

**Consistent Quality Control:** Centralized manufacturing and rigorous quality control permit consistency in products and accelerated menu innovation.

**Loyal Urban Customer Base:** The brand enjoys high loyalty from urban Gen Z and millennial customers, supported by digital interactions and celebratory offerings.

# Strategic Rationale: Synergies and ChrysCapital's QSR Ambitions

ChrysCapital's investment is more than a wager on brownies:

Platform Play: ChrysCapital is said to be looking at other brands, including The Belgian Waffle Co., to build a multi-brand QSR platform. Theobroma brings an anchor in the upper-end bakery space with expertise in centralized manufacturing, multi-city logistics, digital brand creation, and metro network growth.

Potential Synergies: Supply chain and digital marketing strengths of Theobroma can be cross-leveraged by potential future acquisitions, allowing scale and cost efficiency. Co-location, bundled loyalty schemes, and group procurement can further minimize overheads and increase margins, increasing competitiveness against domestic and international QSR behemoths.

# Potential Future Trajectories Under ChrysCapital

Apart from reviving IPO plans, a few directions may open up for Theobroma:

Aggressive Store Growth: Greater penetration in Tier 2–3 cities and frequency formats (airport stores, kiosks) are probable.

New Product Categories and Lines: With greater resources, Theobroma can explore related snacking, ready-to-eat, or drinks categories, adding to its core bakery brand. International Markets: Southeast Asia or GCC (Middle East) may be natural extension targets, riding the Indian diaspora's brand awareness. Strategic Partnerships: Partnerships with hotel chains, airlines, or co-branded retail offerings might liberate new revenues and brand visibility.

#### Conclusion

ChrysCapital's backing of Theobroma showcases the thirst for high-end, scalable Indian brands and the promise to build a homegrown QSR platform competitive with global titans. Theobroma is poised for aggressive growth, varied innovation, and expanded market penetration, if its founders and new stakeholders overcome integration hurdles and are steadfast in upholding the brand's core commitment.
